



IF EVACUATING

NEVER leave your pet at home. Most evacuations last only a few days, but sometimes you may not be able to return to your home quickly because of fallen power lines and other hazards.

Your pet should wear a collar with its rabies tag and identification at all times and have a sturdy crate or carrier for transport.

- Call 800-252-7894 or go to **akcreunite.org** to confirm your pet's microchip has your current contact information.
- If you plan to go to a hotel, call ahead to confirm your pet is welcome.

A current color photograph of you and your pet together, in case you are separated



Bowls, lots of water and food for at least three days



Copies of medical records that indicate dates of vaccinations and a list of medications your pet takes and why



Collapsible cage or carrier with a cotton sheet to place over the carrier to help keep your pet calm



Proof of identification and ownership, including copies of registration information, adoption papers, proof of purchase, and microchip information



Collar, leash, comforting toys and treats

Blanket, flashlight and batteries



Physical description of your pet, including species, breed, age, sex, color, distinguishing traits, and any other vital information about characteristics and behavior



Fully charged cell phone



Animal first aid kit, including flea and tick treatment, and other items/medication recommended by your veterinarian



Items for clean-up

• For cats: Litter, litter pan, and scoop

• For dogs: Plastic bags

TAKE ACTION AT THE FIRST MENTION OF A PENDING DISASTER

- Bring your pets inside so you won't have to search for them if you need to evacuate
- Make sure collars are securely fastened with up-to-date identification and your supplies and your pet's supplies are ready to GRAB-AND-GO.
- Call ahead to confirm emergency shelter's arrangements can accommodate you and your pet.
- **REMEMBER**...the safest place for your pet is to be with YOU!
